## THANK YOU FOR HELPING SHAPE OUR HISTORY

GIA Alums have a lot to celebrate in 2012, as the GIA Alumni Association marks its 30th-anniversary.

Richard T. Liddicoat, one of GIA's founding fathers, and Bob Earnest, an Institute veteran, formed the GIA Alumni Association in 1982. These GIA visionaries recognized that their students shared a special camaraderie and were bound by a passion for education excellence. They listened as graduates spanning the globe asked: how could they stay connected to GIA education, its research, and to each other?

Aware that they looked to the Institute for an answer, the need to formalize an organization of GIA graduates became evident.

"It is essential for every jeweler to keep up to date," Mr. Liddicoat wrote. "One of the most important [ways to do so] is in dialogue with others. One of the great benefits of an Alumni Association is that it establishes contacts between graduates in any given area and across the globe. So they're not just fellow members of an association, these members become educators, colleagues, and friends."

Thanks to the foresight and determination of these gentlemen, the groundwork was laid to grow a network of alums from the approximately 1,500 members who joined that first year, to the more than 80,000 active members today. And though the Alumni Association has evolved from snail mail to email, and print to digital messaging and education, remarkably, our core principles and goals remain the same:

- To create an extensive communications network among members
- To keep alums informed of new developments in gemology
- To promote good will among membership, the public, and the gem and jewelry trade

Auction Market Resource is now solely a website.

On March 2004, she became the Executive Director of The National Association of Jewelry Appraisers – the largest membership association specializing exclusively in gem and jewelry appraising and related appraisal issues.

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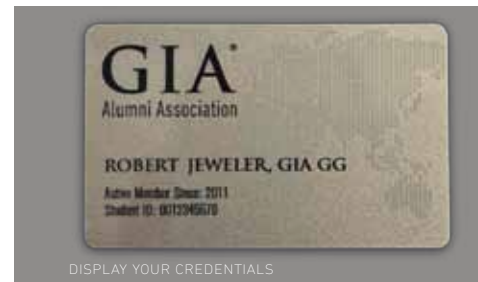
