DEFINITIONS:

“150% Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program length (includes on-time graduates).

“150% Completion Rate” is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for graduation.

“First Available Exam Date” is the date for the first available exam after a student completed a program.

“Graduates Available for Employment” means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.

“Graduates Unavailable for Employment” means the graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.

“Graduates Employed in the Field” means graduates who, beginning within six months after a student completes the applicable educational program, are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported, and for whom the institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the six months period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student completes an applicable educational program.

“No Salary Information Reported” is the number of graduates for whom, after making reasonable attempts, the school was not able to obtain salary information.

“Number of Graduates Taking Exam” is the number of graduates who took the first available exam in the reported calendar year.

“Number of On-time Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year.

“Number of Students Who Began the Program” means the number of students who began a program who were scheduled to complete the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year and excludes all students who cancelled during the cancellation period.

“Number Who Passed First Available Exam” is the number of graduates who took and passed the first available licensing exam after completing the program.

“On-time Completion Rate” is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.

“Passage Rate” is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who passed the exam by the number of graduates who took the reported licensing exam.

“Placement Rate Employed in the Field” is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.

“Salary” is as reported by graduate or graduate’s employer.

“Students Available for Graduation” is the number of students who began the program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.

STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

Lab Class

Cancellation

I understand that I have the right to cancel my enrollment at any time before the end date specified on page one the enrollment agreement by notifying the manager of admissions in writing by mail or in person at The Robert Mouawad Campus, Mailstop #3, 5345 Armada Drive, Carlsbad, California 92008, by email at admissions@gia.edu, or by fax at 760 603 4003.

If I wish to withdraw from a Lab Class after the class has started, I should notify the office of the dean of students in writing by email at deanstudents@gia.edu.

I will be withdrawn from class if I fail to maintain satisfactory academic progress, or otherwise dismissed due to lack of attendance or violation of GIA policy. In all cases where my enrollment is terminated (cancellation or withdrawal), refunds will be calculated based on the Refund Policy below.

If I withdraw and wish to continue my studies at a later date, I will be required to re-enroll into the class from the beginning at current tuition and fees.

Refund Policy

GIA's Lab Class Refund Policy complies with California Education Code §94921, and utilizes an alternative method of calculating tuition refunds. GIA does not charge or retain an application fee or deposit.

Students will receive a full refund of all monies paid if the class is canceled by GIA.

Students who have received a scholarship are subject to the refund policy described in their scholarship acceptance letter.

Students who have obtained a loan to pay for an educational program, will be responsible for repaying the full amount of the loan plus interest, less the amount of any refund to the lender. If they default on a federal or state loan, both the following may occur: (1) The federal or state government or a loan guarantee agency may take action against the student, including applying any income tax refund to which the person is entitled to reduce the balance owed on the loan. (2) The student may not be eligible for any other federal student financial aid at another institution or other government financial assistance until the loan is repaid.

If a refund is due, it will be processed back to the original remitter in the same manner payment was received. Cash payments will be refunded by check. Refunds are processed within 30 days of

the date GIA received the notice of cancellation or withdrawal, or the last date of attendance, whichever is later.

Lab Classes 5 Days in Length:

If my enrollment is cancelled:

- Before the end of the first day of instruction, GIA does not retain tuition.
- After the first day of instruction and up through 60% of the class has been taught, GIA retains a pro rata portion of the tuition.
- After 60% of the class has been taught, GIA retains 100% of tuition.

Lab Classes 1-3 Days in Length:

If my enrollment is cancelled:

- Before 12:00 p.m. of the first day of instruction, GIA does not retain tuition.
- After 12:00 p.m. of the first day of instruction and up through 60% of the class has been taught, GIA retains a pro rata portion of the tuition
- After 60% of the class has been taught, GIA retains 100% of tuition.

Unused books and materials, that are undamaged, are eligible for full refund upon inspection by GIA. Books and materials that are used or not returned in salable condition are not subject to refund.
