¹Graduates means the number of students who completed the program within the reporting period.

²Non-completers means the number of students who have dropped, been terminated by the school, or have ceased instruction in the program by any other manner within the reporting period.

³Still Enrolled/Continuing Students means the number of students who were still enrolled in a program of instruction on the last day of the reporting period.

⁴Related Field means Graduates who found employment in a field related to the training provided where the skills obtained through the curricular training are either essential and necessary or are beneficial and useful for the employment obtained.

⁵Seeking Employment means the Number of Graduates minus the Number of Graduates unavailable for employment. Graduates unavailable for employment are those individuals who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are international students who leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are pursuing additional education at GIA or any other school.
